Please follow the directions in the application carefully. The completed applications, **minus the recommendations**, must be submitted to Mrs. Flynn in room A-163A (office) no later than November 17, 2025 in a sealed envelope with your name on it. Following submission of applications, students may be scheduled for a mandatory interview. Additionally, candidate names will be submitted to all teachers in order to assess the academic integrity of that candidate.

All students who submit an application and are conditionally accepted are obligated to begin the program in August of 2026. It is imperative that this is understood. Building-wide staffing and scheduling decisions will be made based on the quantity of students who are projected to participate in this Programme, so your commitment to entering it is critical.

No applicant will be considered without completing this process in its entirety. Please ensure that all sections are completed and all required information submitted.

5. Upon receipt of this application, you may be invited to formally interview with the IBDP Admissions Committee via email.

IBDP Exam Registration Agreement

As an International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) Candidate, I acknowledge that it is mandatory for my child to be registered for six IB Exams and for Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS), the Extended Essay and Theory of Knowledge by the IBDP Coordinator, Mrs. Flynn, by the September, 2026 deadline. I also acknowledge and agree to pay \$750 towards the cost of my IB registration with a check made payable to Stamford High School or with cash by September, 2027. I understand that Mrs. Flynn will work with families on an individual basis should a financial need be present. The district also waives testing fees for qualifying students who fill out and submit the Stamford Household Income Survey and are approved.

Please be aware that if your child does not sit for one or more exams or if your child is denied an IB course grade (and thus the IB Diploma) due to a violation of the SHS IB Academic Integrity Policy, I may be asked to reimburse the Stamford Public School district for ALL dues paid to the International Baccalaureate Organization associated with course registration(s) and other IB Diploma Programme Registration fees. The International Baccalaureate Organization considers all registrations final and therefore provides no refunds to schools. For this reason, Stamford High School provides no refunds to students.

The International Baccalaureate Organization charges a late fee of \$60 for registration of any subject beyond the published registration deadline (November 1, 2027). Registrations or amendments after the late registration period are charged \$250. No student will be registered without payment.
